Waikato Regional Day, 5 October 2019.

Auckland Regional Day, 31 August 2019, a success.

Sponsored by the North Shore Historical Society, no less than 31 people registered for the Auckland area regional day at The Lake House in Takapuna. Following a welcome from John Webster, President of the North Shore Historical Society, those attending heard presentations from societies at Otahuhu, North Shore, Torbay, Franklin Heritage, the New Zealand Military History Society, Birkenhead, Parnell Heritage, Glenfield, Silverdale, Onehunga, Papakura and Papatoetoe, along with Waikato and Cambridge. General themes included maintaining membership numbers, the upcoming Auckland Heritage Festival and dealing with Auckland Council agencies, especially Panuku.

After lunch, Bev Parslow from Heritage New Zealand spoke to an archaeological investigation of the Melanesian Mission site at Mission Bay on Tamaki Drive. Bev used photographs and maps, including the results of ground penetrating radar, to detail the site. There is now a restaurant built over the site, but special care has been taken to preserve it for the future. See the full conservation plan at:

President of the New Zealand History Federation, Lisa Truttman, then spoke about work on revising the constitution and preparations for the next Annual General Meeting, at Henderson.
